

“Getting started with...” the HWEC multimedia website

Installing the product...

To install the product, firstly download or otherwise obtain some FTP software. SmartFTP 2 (<http://smartftp.com>) is recommended by the developer as a simple tool enabling novice users to make use of the File Transfer Protocol. Install the FTP client and set up the following FTP account:

Server address: <ftp.hwec.org.uk>
Username: [Removed for security purposes]
Password: [Removed for security purposes]

When you gain access to the server, insert the HWEC CD-ROM into your computer's D:\ drive. It should automatically load up a window containing a multiple folders and files. This is as expected so do not worry.

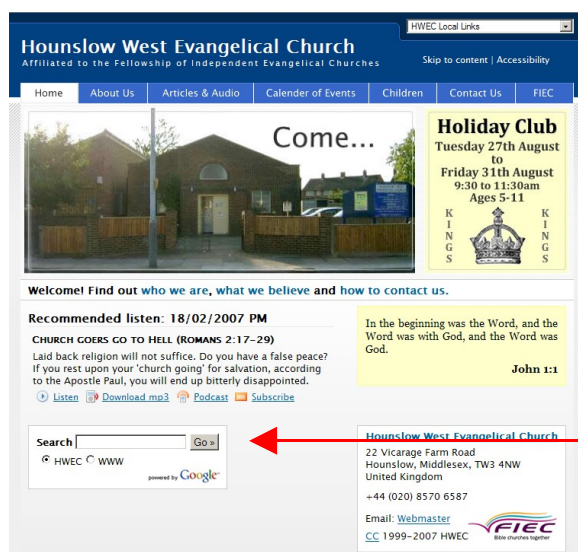
Proceed to navigate to the D:/ drive in your FTP client's Local Host Browser. When you find yourself in the correct directory, drag and drop all the contents of the CD-ROM to the Remote Host Browser that's logged into the HWEC server.

When the upload is complete, test that the website works as intended by starting up your favourite internet browser and entering: <http://hwec.org.uk/> into the address (URL) input box. An alternative would be to search for HWEC on Google.

If the website has been updated the installation is complete, else go back to the beginning of this document and start everything again reading each instruction carefully and thoughtfully. If you still are having problems, contact me immediately.

Using the product...

The HWEC website has been designed to provide an intuitive multimedia experience to all users. It combines navigational clarity and considered cosmetics.



← This is the main navigation of the multimedia product. It contains links to the most significant parts of the site, including those reflective audio files.

← The search provided in the footer aids users in finding the content they want in a significant way. To use it, enter your search phrase into the field and click “Go”

Listening to audio...


The product provides many different ways of enjoying that crucial multimedia experience of listening to sermons from the Sunday services. The first examples of this that you as a user will come across are the 'Recommended listen:' section of the 'Home' and the 'Articles & Audio' index pages.



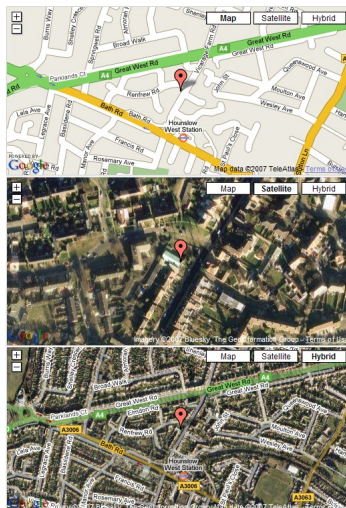
Use the same method as above to listen to the sermon of your choice.

Using the Google Map on the 'How to find us' page...

Integrating this feature into the product has provided you, the user, with an even more exciting multimedia experience. Below to the left is a screen shot of the Google Map operating in the three different available modes:



Map, satellite and hybrid are the names of the three options. The default is 'Map' and it's centred with a pointer on the church building.

You are able to zoom in and out in all three modes and you can also drag the map up, down, left, right to your heart's desire.

Underneath the Google Maps is a field where you can enter your address and receive directions to the church.
